SSAT Bootcamp and Camp Games

For students who have completed grades 4 through 9. Please bring pencils, calculator, snack, and drink.

The SSAT (Secondary School Admission Test) is used by independent schools to assess the abilities of students applying for admission. This four-day workshop devotes a day to strategies for completing each section of the SSAT (quantitative, verbal, reading comprehension, writing), interspersed with fun, classical camp games, such as capture the flag and ghost in the graveyard. The fifth day is an optional practice test.

Why take the practice test? Students will be provided with practice materials and an in-depth analysis of their progress. An action plan for further study and practice test results will be mailed home after the camp has ended.

ACT/SAT Bootcamp

For students who have completed grades 9 through 11. Please bring pencils, calculator, snack, and drink.

In this intensive, 5-day course, students will cover content and strategies for all the sections of the ACT and SAT. Before the course begins, students will complete and submit a sample exam, and will receive individually-tailored feedback on strengths and weaknesses. During the course, students will have an hour of practice each night, to further cement the strategies and concepts

covered that day and to prepare for the next day's class. Following the course, students will receive a personalized action plan to use as they prepare for the test.

Bright Minds, Big Fun

Latin through Mythology

Using materials targeted at elementary school and building on classical mythology, students will learn the beginnings of Latin as well as focus on its history in the development of English and other continental languages. Students will also learn how to think about larger linguistic issues: how do words fit together to make meaning? Where do words come from? How does language shape culture? At the end of the course, students will have the tools to continue to study independently!

Scenes from Shakespeare

Shakespeare is a towering figure in the landscape of English literature, influencing the very fabric of the language we speak. His plays are seen as the pinnacle of theatre. It can be a little intimidating. The goal of this camp is to help students see that one of the reasons for his enduring popularity is that his plays are entertaining. We'll focus on a few key scenes in one play (steered by student interest!) and really dig deep into the meaning. Students will learn about how Shakespearean language and poetry works, as well as the mechanics of the Elizabethan stage. We'll make costumes and perform the scenes for parents at the end of camp!

The Science of Learning

For students who have completed grades 5 through 9. Please bring a snack and drink.

Just in time for the beginning of school, this course will examine how to take a student's learning to the next level. Inspired by research, we will look at methods for how to best learn. This is not intended to provide strategies just to get an A (although we will discuss

those), but instead provide methods to gain lasting, effective, and life-long knowledge and understanding through demonstrated, scientific research.

Why do you get a fever when you're sick? Why does your nose run? How do vaccines work to prevent illness? In this camp, students will focus on the human immune system. After exploring how the immune system works, we will learn about a few common illnesses, such as the flu and strep throat, and how various treatments work to make you feel better. Throughout the week, we will harvest and grow live bacteria and create remedies designed to kill bacteria.

In the post-WWII landscape, both science fiction and fantasy writing exploded in popularity, opening up new literary space as the space race heated up. We will approach them from both a literary standpoint and a scientific one, thinking about how science interacts with culture.

Campers will be divided into two groups by age, with discussions led by both instructors.
